ABOUT OUR *Camp*

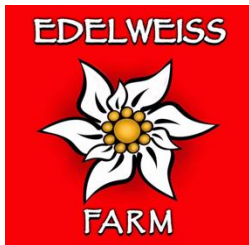

We will provide a fun, safe and well-rounded horse camp experience where children can immerse themselves in the moment and enjoy themselves in a non-competitive environment.

We have a limited amount of space to ensure the greatest amount of safety, education, and fun. Mounted lessons will be taught by professional on-site instructors.

During this camp the kids will:

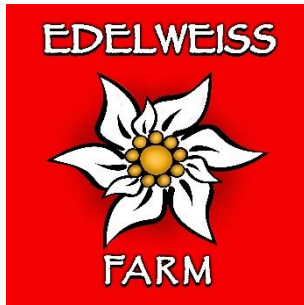

Release of Liability / Hold Harmless Agreement

Witness this agreement by and between Edelweiss Farm, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "Management", and _____, hereinafter referred to as "Rider", "Visitor", and "Boarder" (or Parent or Guardian, if said person is a Minor).

For consideration received, and in return for the use, today and on all future dates of the property, facilities and services of Management, Management's instructors, employees, drivers and agents; Rider/Visitor/Boarder, his/her heirs, assigns, and representatives, hereby agree as follows:

1. **Inherent Risks and Assumption of Risk.** The undersigned acknowledges that there are inherent risks associated with equine activities such as described below, and hereby expressly assumes all risks associated with participating in such activities. The inherent risks include, but are not limited to, the propensity of equines to behave in ways such as running, bucking, biting, kicking, shying, stumbling, rearing, falling or stepping on, that may result in an injury, harm or death to persons on or around them; the unpredictability of equines' reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals; certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; collisions with other animals; the limited availability of emergency medical care; and the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the animal or not acting within such participant's ability.

Rider/Visitor/Boarder acknowledges that horses, by their very nature, are unpredictable and subject to animal whim. Rider/Visitor/Boarder assumes all risks in connection therewith, and expressly waives any claims for any injury or loss arising therefrom. Rider/Visitor/Boarder agrees to abide by and follow Management's rules and regulations, which shall be posted and/or available from time to time. Rider/Visitor/Boarder further acknowledges that the behavior of any animal is contingent to some extent upon the ability of Rider/Visitor/Boarder. Rider/Visitor/Boarder assumes all risks therefore and warrants a full and fair disclosure of his/her ability has been made to management.

Rider/Visitor/Boarder expressly releases Management from any and all claims for personal injury or property damage, even if caused by negligence by Management or its representatives, agents or employees.

WARNING

Under North Carolina law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. Chapter 99E of the North Carolina General Statutes.

2. Rider/Visitor/Boarder agrees to assume any and all risks involved in or arising out of his/her use of any equipment or livestock pertaining to the rental of horses or taking of riding lessons, the use of any arena on the premises of Management and for purposes of taking riding lessons either on the premises or lessons given off the premises by Management personnel/
3. Rider/Visitor/Boarder agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Management against, and hold harmless from, any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages, judgements, orders, costs or expenses, including attorney's fees, whether actually incurred or not, which may in any way arise from or be in any way connected with Rider/Visitor/Boarder's use of or presence upon the property of Management and the facilities located thereon.
4. In the event Rider/Visitor/Boarder is using his/her own horse, or a horse(s) not owned by Management, Rider warrants said horse(s) shall be free from infection, contagious or transmittable diseases. Management reserves the right to refuse access or use of any horse upon he premises that does not appear to Manager to be in good health, or is deemed dangerous or undesirable.
5. Any action brought under this agreement shall be brought within one (1) year of the incident or accident giving rise to this claim. Rider/Visitor/Boarder agrees that damages shall be limited to \$250 for property damage, actual expenses incurred, and a maximum of \$10,000 for damages such as pain and suffering.
6. Rider/Visitor/Boarder agrees to waive the protection of any applicable statutes in this jurisdiction whose purpose, substance and/or effect is to provide that a general release shall not extend to claims, material or otherwise, which the person giving the release does not know or suspect to exist at the time of executing said release.
